PRAYED THE ROSARY TWICE DAILY

In 1914 the Mora family moved to Los Pajuiles, a village in San José de Bolívar, Venezuela. When 5 years old, he started to work with his father and siblings in agriculture, specifically coffee harvesting and sugar cane.

At 10, he began school but was only able to attend for five months because his teacher became very ill. However, Mora was able to learn how to read and write thanks to a book his teacher had given him prior to her health declining.

He was married to Ediofina del Rosario García for 60 years. The family has now grown to include 42 grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren, and 12 great-great-grandchildren.

Among his family, Mora was known for his faith. He strived to build a solid relationship with God, his relatives, and he prayed the Rosary twice a day. He died at the age of 114 on April 2, 2024.

Mora said his secret to living a long life was to "work hard, rest on holidays, go to bed early, drink a glass of aguardiente every day, love God, and always carry him in your heart."

THE ROSARY

The Rosary is the most powerful weapon that the Lord left us other than the Eucharist and the sacraments. Through the Rosary and any prayers "in front of her icon or her image, she can teach us to unite our heart with the heart of Jesus, because her heart is always united to the heart of Jesus. In every icon, especially in the icon of Czestochowa, her hand is pointed to Jesus. She always leads us to Jesus. It is to Jesus through Mary. And by coming to Mary, we learn to unite our hearts to the heart of Jesus and put all our trust in that Sacred Heart of Jesus that was poured out of love for us."

ST. JOSEPH-PATRON SAINT OF THE UNBORN

St. Joseph is considered the Patron Saint of the Unborn. He protected the unborn child Jesus in Mary's womb during the trip to Bethlehem and saved the newborn Savior from Herod's threats. St. Joseph is often depicted holding a six-month fetus, offering the child to Christ.
