## WHAT ABOUT MARY

### Do Catholics worship Mary?

1: Catholics don't worship or adore Mary because we worship only God, and Mary is not God.

2: We venerate her, honor her, and love her as Jesus' mother and our Heavenly Mother.

### Why do Catholics venerate Mary?

Mary herself gives the reason in her "Magnificat" recorded by St. Luke (1:48-49) "*For he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and Holy is his Name.*"

1) God has honored Mary in four ways, and we honor her because God honored her:

- a) He chose her as the mother of His Son, Jesus Christ the Messiah.
- b) In preparation for this role, God made her "Full of grace" by her Immaculate Conception.
- c) He anointed her twice with His Holy Spirit: at the Annunciation and at Pentecost, making her the most Spirit-filled of all women.
- d) God allowed her to participate actively in Christ's suffering and death, suffering in soul all Jesus suffered in body.

2) Mary is our Heavenly Mother, given to us by Jesus from the cross.

Mary is our role model for all virtues, particularly, love, fidelity, humility, obedience, surrender to the will of God, and patience.

## THE VIRGIN OF ALMUDENA

Every Nov. 9, the Church in Spain celebrates the Virgin of Almudena, the patroness of Madrid, whose image "hides" a peculiar story that might not be familiar to many.

During the Muslim invasion of the Iberian Peninsula in the eighth century, the faithful decided to hide an image of the Virgin Mary in one of the towers of the wall that surrounded the Spanish capital. They placed it there in order to protect the statue, since during that time the Muslims eliminated all signs of Catholicism that crossed their path.

Years later, the Spanish tried to recover the image, although without success, since they were unable to find the exact place in the wall where the Virgin had been hidden.

Because of this, King Alfonso VI decided to hold a procession around the wall in honor of the Virgin, which took place on Nov. 9, 1085.

While the faithful processed around Madrid's wall, part of the wall of one of the towers collapsed. Behind the rubble appeared the image of the Virgin next to two lighted candles.

Since then, the image has been known as the Virgin of Almudena, since in Arabic "almudayna" means "citadel," or "walled military compound." Under this title, Our Lady was named patroness of the city by decree in 1908.

On the hill where the statue of the Virgin of Almudena was found, a cathedral in her honor was later built, a symbol of the faith of the people of Madrid. It is visited by thousands of tourists every year.

## A RICH SOURCE OF GRACE

*Eucharistic Adoration is one of the richest sources of graces for souls.*

After the Sacrifice of the Mass and the reception of Holy Communion, visiting the Blessed Sacrament is one of the richest sources of grace for souls. The memorable words of Pope St. Pius X, the Pope of the Eucharist, show us clearly how he regarded such visits: "The daily adoration or visit to the Blessed Sacrament is the practice which is the fountainhead of all devotional works." In these daily visits, therefore, St. Pius X recognized the root of Eucharistic devotions.

By daily visiting the Blessed Sacrament, we follow the footsteps of the first Christians. In the catacombs were frequently found representations of the shepherds and the Magi kneeling before the Infant Jesus. Animated by the living faith that Jesus is present in the Eucharist, with Divinity and Humanity, with Body and Soul, with Flesh and Blood, these early Christians said with the shepherds, "Let us go to Bethlehem"; with the Magi, "falling down they adored him." (Matt. 2:11)
